Series: Pope Francis' coronavirus catechesis



The pope's series, which began in Aug. 5, focuses on healing the world from the physical and social ills related to the coronavirus pandemic.

Catechesis 5- September 2

"The current pandemic has highlighted our interdependence: we are all connected to each other, for better or for worse. Therefore, to emerge from this crisis better than before, we have to do so together; together, not alone. Together. Not alone, because it cannot be done. Either it is done together, or it is not done. We must do it together, all of us, in solidarity."

Notable quotes:

"As a human family we have our common origin in God; we live in a common home, the garden-planet, the earth where God placed us; and we have a common destination in Christ. But when we forget all this, our interdependence becomes dependence of some on others — we lose this harmony of interdependence and solidarity — increasing inequality and marginalization; the social fabric is weakened and the environment deteriorates."

"In the midst of crises, a solidarity guided by faith enables us to translate the love of God in our globalized culture, not by building towers or walls that divide, but by interweaving communities and sustaining processes of growth that are truly human and solid."

As you do so, we suggest that you prepare your spirit for this experience. You might, with St. Francis, share his Cantic of Creation. October 4 is his Feast Day!

The Cantic of Creation (by Saint Francis of Assisi)

O Most High, all-powerful, good Lord God,
to you belong praise, glory,
honour and all blessing.
Be praised, my Lord, for all your creation
and especially for our Brother Sun,
who brings us the day and the light;
he is strong and shines magnificently.
O Lord, we think of you when we look at him.
Be praised, my Lord, for Sister Moon,
and for the stars
which you have set shining and lovely
in the heavens.
Be praised, my Lord,
for our Brothers Wind and Air
and every kind of weather
by which you, Lord,
uphold life in all your creatures.
Be praised, my Lord, for Sister Water,
who is very useful to us,
and humble and precious and pure.
Be praised, my Lord, for Brother Fire,
through whom you give us light in the darkness:
he is bright and lively and strong.
Be praised, my Lord,
for Sister Earth, our Mother,
who nourishes us and sustains us,
bringing forth
fruits and vegetables of many kinds
and flowers of many colours.
Be praised, my Lord,
for those who forgive for love of you;
and for those
who bear sickness and weakness
in peace and patience
- you will grant them a crown.
Be praised, my Lord, for our Sister Death,
whom we must all face.
I praise and bless you, Lord,
and I give thanks to you,
and I will serve you in all humility.

Or simply be aware that all that God has created is an expression of God's Love, is an expression of the Presence of God. You are in the Presence of God as you walk in this Creation – in every tree, plant, flower, bird, animal insect, the earth beneath your feet, the air you breathe, the sky, sun, and clouds.....This is a Sacred Pilgrimage! Give attention to everything as sacred gift.

How do you feel as you walk?
What gifts are you receiving as you walk?
Can you, like St. Francis, feel a deep, personal relationship with all of Creation? What is it like to live in that kind of interrelationship?
With Creation being the material Presence of God, what do you wish for this sacred Creation, and how are you ready to give of yourself, as Creation gives of herself for you?
