The pope's catechesis focuses on healing the world from the physical and social ills related to the coronavirus pandemic.

Catechesis 4 - Aug. 26

"Social inequality and environmental degradation go together and have the same root (see Encyclical, <u>Laudato Si'</u>, 101): the sin of wanting to possess and wanting to dominate one's brothers and sisters, of wanting to possess and dominate nature and God Himself. But this is not the design for creation."

Pope Francis leans on the idea of the universal destination of goods to call out injustices in the care for the economy and the environment. He denounces intense economic stratification and a throwaway culture that is devastating to the planet. He warns listeners not to transform property and money into ends but to instead take inspiration from the early Christian communities who weathered challenges by putting goods in common.
