Catechesis 3- Aug. 19

Social inequality and environmental degradation go together and have the same root (see Encyclical, <u>Laudato Si'</u>, 101): the sin of wanting to possess and wanting to dominate one's brothers and sisters, of wanting to possess and dominate nature and God Himself. But this is not the design for creation."

Society of Saint Vincent de Paul - Holy Name Conference Parish Report 2020

We celebrate the feast day of **Saint Vincent de Paul on Sept. 27**. Around this time members wish to provide you with an update on how we have used your donations.

In 2019, through the generosity of parishioners and visitors, we collected \$17,108 in donations, through regular and Christmas envelopes and through poor box collections after mass. We put these funds to work by supporting our neighbours in need. We spent \$16,630 for expenses such as food, grocery gift cards, furniture, our phone line and postage. When possible, we share some of the funds to support other good works of The Society such as shelters and housing for those with developmental disabilities, leaving abusive households, mental health challenges, prison apostolate, court services and of course the children's camps. In 2019 we shared \$2,000 for this cause, using some of the funds left from 2018 and 2019.

In 2019 we visited more than 51 different homes and made 126 visits to individuals or families, bringing food, a grocery store gift card to purchase fresh food, a voucher to purchase clothing at Salvation Army Stores and/or furniture (usually beds). In total, we served 186 adults and 62 children. For Christmas 2019 we held a reception and created Christmas hampers, along with gifts for children. We served 108 adults and 67 children.

This year all of us have been impacted by COVID-19 and normally we would have been extremely restricted in the service we are able to provide. We have been fortunate in continuing to receive donations from many parishioners by way of putting an envelope in the basket at the back of the church or through the mail slot at the rectory. Significant donations were also received following the passing of a beloved member of our conference. Thus, our ability to assist our neighbours has not been impacted.

We would also like to remind you that if your workplace has an annual giving campaign such as the United Way or Canada Helps, please consider directing your contributions to Society of Saint Vincent de Paul - Holy Name Conference. Most corporate giving campaigns allow you to specify which charitable institution your funds will support.

We could not do this good work without the support of parishioners of Holy Name Church and Father Jinto. Members wish to extend our sincere gratitude for your prayers, encouragement and donations. You are instrumental in our mission to serve Christ through the poor. God bless each of you.
