6th Sunday in Ordinary time Year C

In the gospel reading for the third Sunday in Ordinary Time, we heard Jesus proclaiming to the people of his home town of Nazareth that his mission was “to bring good news to the poor, to proclaim liberty to captives and new sight to the blind, to free the downtrodden and to proclaim the Lord’s year of favour”. The four “beatitudes” at the start of today’s gospel are a more poetic rendition of his mission statement and directed pointedly to the strugglers in his audience. His intention was to offer them a message of hope and encouragement. Jesus’ words are a reminder to us that, whatever our circumstance, we are not overlooked by God. We are not alone in our experiences, our needs and our losses.

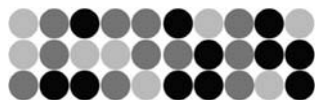

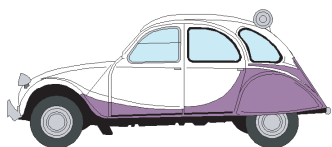
