

We will resume our Children's Liturgy Program (for the children aged 6-11) beginning with the First Sunday of Lent, Sunday, March 6, 2022.

We invite your children (between the ages of 6 and 11), to rejoin our Children's Liturgy Program, if you, and they, are interested.

We will be set up in the same format as in December, 2021, in the Church Hall, with a large circle of chairs for our gospel, and with tables set up for the children's activities—while maintaining safe distancing.

Based on the instructions we have received from the Archdiocese, we will have the following guidelines):

1—"Masks must still be worn indoors"
(according to the Archdiocese)
2--we will continue with a distancing
requirement of 6 feet between all participants
3--the diocese is still indicating that "recording contact tracing information is still the 'best practice' "we were able to assemble a good contact tracing list for the child participants (back in December, 2021), Parents of any new children who join our group in the coming weeks will be asked to add their names to that master list.

At the beginning of Mass, Fr. Jinto will ask the children to stand up, and the children will proceed downstairs to the program. The children will return upstairs before the Consecration.
