Pope Francis's Message for Lent 2022

Pope Francis based his **Message for Lent 2022** on a passage from St Paul's Letter to the Galatians, "Let us not grow tired of doing good, for in due time we shall reap our harvest, if we do not give up. So then, while we have the opportunity, let us do good to all" (6:9-10).

Beginning with the image of sowing and reaping, Pope Francis writes that "Lent invites us to conversion, to a change in mindset, so that life's truth and beauty may be found not so much in possessing as in giving, not so much in accumulating as in sowing and sharing goodness."

Pope Francis connects Paul's words to the Galatians to the traditional Lenten practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. In this season of conversion, he reminds us, **the soil of our hearts "is prepared by fasting, watered by prayer and enriched by charity."**

God of the journey, lead us this Lent into the desert where we fast from self-absorption and feast on compassion and fast from despair and feast on hope.

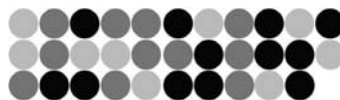

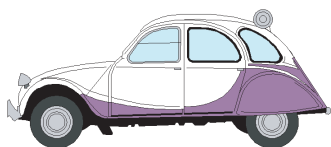
