SEASON OF CREATION 2022 THEME: LISTEN TO THE VOICE OF CREATION

This is the last weekend in the Season of Creation, and yet the Voices of Creation continue to speak to us, calling us and encouraging us. **How will we continue to respond?**

- 1. Begin with a Contemplative Earth Examen (copies at doors of the Church). It will invite us into a deeper sense of God's Presence in Creation, and how to be in a lifegiving relationship with Creation. Enter into this alone, with family, or with a small group. (Please let Sr. Mary-Ellen know if a small group would like to enter into this Examen together perhaps after Mass followed by a picnic together.)
- 2. Participate in DEVELOPMENT AND PEACE'S PEOPLE AND PLANET FIRST CAMPAIGN Go to https://www.devp.org/en/campaign/people-planet-first/
- 3. This fall, in Pope Francis' Message for the Season of Creation, he is asking us to get involved in the two major United Nations Meetings: COP 27 taking place in Egypt in November on Climate Change. Cop 15 taking place in Montreal in December on Biodiversity.

It is critical that Canada and all nations of the world decide on much more bold action to save the health of the Planet.

Later in the fall, the Climate Action Group will make a Letter to the Canadian Government available to be signed by parishioners.

- 4. Continue to follow the 7 Ontario Youth who, in September, took the Government of Ontario to Superior Court, accusing the Government of inadequately defending their rights to a strong Climate Action Plan. Go to the website: Ecojustice.ca for the latest news.
- 5. Give attention to the protection of the land of northern Ontario, in particular the "Ring of Fire". The Ontario Government is wishing to extract valuable minerals to be used in batteries for electric cars. The plans are going forward without involving consultation with the Indigenous peoples of this land for their free, prior and informed consent to use of the land.


