
# A Thanksgiving Lrayer

# Holy Name Truth and Reconciliation

In an effort to continue to deepen our understanding of Indigenous communities and strengthen relations through reconciliation, the Holy Name Truth and Reconciliation group invites you to an evening of learning and reflection with Bev Sellars. Bev Sellars is a former councilor and chief of the Xat'sull (Soda Creek) First Nation in Williams Lake, British Columbia. She is an activist who has spoken out on racism and residential schools and on the environment.

We are excited to have Bev Sellars join the Parish on October 20, 2022, at 7:30pm for a one-hour presentation and discussion about her awardwinning first book, "They Called Me Number One." The book is a memoir of her childhood experience in the Indian residential school system and its effects on three generations of women in her family. Her second book, Price Paid: The Fight for First Nations Survival, explores the history of Indigenous rights in Canada from an Indigenous perspective. Sellars has a degree in history from the University of Victoria and a law degree from the University of British Columbia. If you would like to participate in the event, you are encouraged to read "They Called Me Number One" prior to her presentation on Oct. 20th. The gathering will take place at the church using a live ZOOM platform. Please join us to listen, discuss, learn and reflect with Bev and fellow parishioners.
