Dear Parishioners,

Our scripture readings for this weekend teach us some valuable lessons about our prayer life. Being persistent, constant, and untiring in prayer is important. God is untiring in trying to reach us, untiring in trying to come into our hearts. Time and again Jesus tells us that we should pray, pray a lot, pray often, and be untiring in turning to God.

That is the important point we heard about in today's first reading taken from the Book of Exodus. There, the Israelites were in a fight against one of their enemies. Moses was on top of a hill overlooking the battle and the author of the Book of Exodus tells us:

As long as Moses kept his hands raised up, Israel had the better of the fight, but when he let his hands rest, Amalek had the better of the fight. Moses' hands, however, grew tired; so they put a rock in place for him to sit on. Meanwhile Aaron and Hur supported his hands, one on one side and one on the other, so that his hands remained steady till sunset. And Joshua mowed down Amalek and his people with the edge of the sword.

In today's Gospel account we hear Jesus giving us the parable of the woman who continually calls on the judge to hear and answer her petition. Through this parable Jesus is telling us that consistency, perseverance, steadfastness, along with continuing courage, are needed in our lives and that these strengths, these virtues can be found only in a life lived out in persistent prayer. Prayer should be our normal way of life, not just a last resort in times of difficulty. We can only live life well and effectively in a sustained connection with God. The month of October is dedicated to Our Lady and to the rosary. So, as individuals and as families, let us continue to seek the intercession of our Blessed Mother by praying the rosary during this month of October. Fr. Vijai, C.S.C.

LISTENING TO THE VOICES OF CREATION

Have you heard of Environmental Racism? It refers to the reality that the most vulnerable groups in Canada – Black, Indigenous, racialized communities – are disproportionately affected by pollutants from industrial plants, abandoned oil and gas wells, and toxic dumps. They are also disproportionately affected by the destruction of habitat and cultural sites from minding, pipelines, and dams. It is urgent for us to contact our MPs and call them to support and vote for Bill C-226, a Private Member Bill tabled by Elizabeth May, MP, called "The National Strategy Respecting Environmental Racism and Environmental Justice Act" when it comes up for debate in Parliament. If passed this legislation will begin to address the grave discrimination in Canada. This action will also respond to the call of Pope Francis in LAUDATO SI' to address Integral Ecology.

Sellars has a degree in history from the University of Victoria and a law degree from the University of British Columbia.
