Society of Saint Vincent de Paul - Holy Name Conference Report 2022

The members of Society of Saint Vincent de Paul-Holy Name Conference would like to provide you with an update on our finances and activities and use this opportunity to thank you for your support. In 2021, through the generosity of Holy Name parishioners and visitors, we collected nearly \$35,000 in donations, \$21,500 of which were tax receipted donations (through gifts in kind, regular and Christmas envelopes) and we had just over \$10,500 in unreceipted donations received from Knights of Columbus, United Way, Canada Helps and funds passed down to us from Toronto East Particular Council, which oversees and guides our conference. 2021 saw an increase in donations of \$1,000 from **2020.** We put these funds to work by supporting our neighbours in need. We do issue tax receipts for donations of \$20 and more.

In 2021 we visited 191 different homes and visited with. on average, 30 individuals or families per month bringing them a Food Basics grocery card, taking requests for clothing and furniture. We served 253 adults and 216 children. Our visits were generally held just outside their home due to COVID precautions. At Christmas this past year we served 193 adults and 133 children. Grocery gift cards and a gift card for parents to purchase a gift for each child was provided. At the end of **September 2022** we have collected almost \$30,000 in donations from parishioners and visitors, Knights of Columbus, United Way and Toronto East Particular Council. We have distributed almost \$25,000 in grocery cards and furniture to our neighbours in need. We also assisted a neighbour with a rent payment due to a special circumstance. We are concerned about the assistance we may be able to provide this Christmas. We will place Christmas envelopes in your November bulletin to allow you to donate a little earlier if you are able to. This will allow up to determine how we can support our neighbours this year at Christmas. A gentle reminder that we have resumed holding the poor box following Mass. Those loonies and toonies add up.

So, now I want to offer sincere blessings to each of you. For your financial assistance, your prayers, your time when you volunteer with us. We never take you for granted. We are also looking for people who want to learn more or may feel a calling to this ministry. It does demand a commitment of your time and may require you to help in leadership down the road. Know you will be putting Christ's love in action and I can assure you that it is very, very rewarding.
