Dear Parishioners,

On November 1, we celebrate the Solemnity of All Saints. I love saints. They are the spiritual superheroes of our church. They provide us with access to a massive list of prayer partners who pray with us and pray for us. They are our models of holiness and we need these heavenly models of holiness. We also need earthly models of holiness. Saints are all around us, women and men whose generous spirit reflects the Gospel call to love and serve God and others. Some do it in ordinary ways, through a spirit of simplicity and humility. Some do it by showing extraordinary courage in sickness and adversity. Some do it by railing against injustice and working to bring equality and dignity to all.

November 2, the Feast of All Souls, dovetails with the Solemnity of All Saints. We commemorate all the faithful departed, who have died with hope and trust in a loving God. In praying for our loved ones during this special time, we give thanks for their lives, and we anticipate our future reunion with them in God's love.

Because of our strong bond in faith, we believe that those who have died continue to be connected with us, concerned about us as we are about them. This leads us in faith to believe that they, too, can intercede with God for us, as we intercede for them.

May the Saints of God pray for us. May the souls of the faithful departed rest in eternal peace.

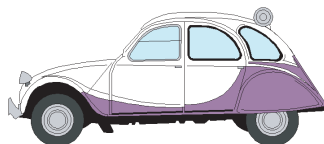
