#### Dear Parishioners,

Today we begin the second week of our Lenten journey of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving in preparation for Easter. A common question that we are often asked during these days is "What are you giving up for Lent?" Hopefully, we don't fall into the trap of seeing our Lenten sacrifices of "giving up" desserts, coffee without sugar, social media, or smoking, simply as an endurance test. To do so would only be self-serving. So, how can giving up chocolate, therefore, bring us closer to God?

Our fasting, in whatever small form it takes, is intended to help us "return to the Lord" with a greater conversion of heart. We are reminded of this in the first reading for Ash Wednesday, from the Prophet Joel, "Even now, says the Lord, return to me with your whole heart, with fasting, and weeping, and mourning" (12:2).

In his *Meditation* on "The Season of Lent," Blessed Basil Moreau, the founder of the Congregation of Holy Cross, tells us that "corporal sacrifice is required, but it is unacceptable without sacrifice of the soul, that is amendment of life." So, during those times when we may feel the "pinch" of our sacrifice, can we take a moment to try to "amend our life" by recalling a person in our family with whom we struggle and to pray for him or her? Can we reflect on how we may have been unfairly judgmental of others during the day and how we can do better in the future? Can our small sacrifices lead us to remember and to pray for those who suffer from hunger, homelessness, or displacement?

Such small practices elicit within us a greater dependence upon God, his mercy and forgiveness, which ultimately brings us closer to Him and leads to our greater conversion of heart to which we are invited to this season. Even in our "giving up," God assures us that He never *gives up* on us, for his love and mercy is everlasting. May this holy season of Lent continue to be a time of renewal and conversion of heart for us all.
