HOLY NAME CLIMATE ACTION GROUP AND GAS-FUELED POWER PLANTS

A number of Climate / Environmental groups in Ontario, along with the NDP, Liberal, and Green Parties are collaborating in their opposition to the Ford Government's intention to choose Gas -Fueled Power Plants to supply Ontario's electricity needs. The Holy Name Climate Action Group supports the opposition view that this decision will greatly increase carbon emissions and make it impossible for Ontario to meet the needed reduction in carbon emissions by 2030.

Locally, the **Portlands Gas Plant** would be expanded, using more gas fuel than it already does.

This plan of the Ford Government flies in the face of the direction being taken by most countries in Europe and many other areas in Canada. The direction which best meets the need of the Planet and human health is to use renewable sources of power for our electricity needs, and also to conserve on our use of electricity. Solar, Wind and Water are the power sources to choose now and into the future. These power sources are also far less costly.
