Dear Parishioners,

All Souls Day: On November 02, we will commemorate All Souls Day, a day dedicated to remembering all the faithful departed. Moreover, the month of November is a special month to remember and pray, in a special way, for all our family members, our community members, our friends and those who do not have anyone to pray for them.

As a way of remembering your loved ones, we invite you write in a sheet of paper, the names of all those whom you would like to remember during the month of November and place it in the basket that will be at the entrance of the Church next weekend, the weekend of **October 28-30**. We will place this basket, with the names of the deceased relatives and friends, before the altar and pray for them in a special way, as a community, during the entire month of November.

In addition, we will continue the traditional practice of the Holy Name Book of Remembrance. We invite you to list in our Book of Remembrance the names of those whom you would like remembered in our Parish liturgies. The Book of Remembrance is placed on the altar and is commended to the prayer of all who join us for Mass. All Souls Day envelopes will be available at the entrance of the Church in which you can list the names of those you wish to be listed in the Book of Remembrance, along with an offering for Masses. You may drop this envelope into the collection basket during the Masses.

On Thursday, November 02, All Souls Day, we will have only the usual 12.05 Mass in the Church. During the Mass, after the homily, those present—and wish to do so—will be invited to come forward before the altar and light a candle in memory of their deceased loved ones. We strongly encourage you to join us for this special Mass to remember your deceased family members and friends.

Pews: You will notice that we have removed a couple of pews at the very front of the Church. As I informed you a few weeks ago, the reason for the removal is twofold: First, to make our communion procession easier, especially for those who are elderly and those mobility difficulties. Secondly, with to better accommodate funeral liturgies with casket, that is, so that the casket can be turned around before its procession back to the entrance of the Church, after the funeral Masses. Thank you for your understanding and support to this project.


For the Sacrament of Reconciliation, the children will attend 4 classes in November, followed by a family day in early December and the Sacrament of Reconciliation.
