Dear Parishioners,

We find ourselves at the end of our Lenten journey, as we begin the Holy Week. Palm Sunday marks the beginning of the holiest liturgical year. season of the Jesus triumphantly enters Jerusalem to the cheers of the crowd who hail Him as a King - "Lo, your king comes to you; triumphant and victorious is he, humble and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey" (Zech 9:9).
