#### Dear Parishioners,

The month of October is traditionally dedicated in the Church to the Holy Rosary. Hopefully we are always trying to stay close to Our Lady throughout the year by praying the Rosary, but October is a good month to perhaps re-focus our efforts in doing so.

Why has October been chosen as the month dedicated to the Rosary? On October 7<sup>th</sup>, the Church celebrates the Feast of Our Lady of the Holy Rosary. There is quite an interesting and inspiring history behind the origins of this feast.

Now the Rosary itself likely began in the early 13<sup>th</sup> century, through the initiative of St. Dominic. He had a great devotion to Our Lady, and he recognized the value of uniting ourselves with her in meditating on the events in the life of Jesus. The "invention" of the Rosary, then, is credited to St. Dominic. For the next two centuries, so many in the Church experienced the great comfort and spiritual assistance that came from praying the Rosary. Many also recognized the Rosary as a great way to call upon Our Blessed Mother for her intercession in times of difficulty.

One of these great difficulties happened in the late 1500s. Much of the Church was facing a challenge from the advancing armies of a powerful enemy. The Pope at that time, Pius V, called upon all of the faithful to pray the Rosary, imploring the prayers of Our Lady for protection. On October 7<sup>th</sup>, 1571, a great victory took place in what was called the Battle of Lepanto. The people were protected, peace was achieved, and it was credited almost entirely to the protection of Our Lady that was brought about through fervent praying of the Rosary. Since then, October 7<sup>th</sup> has always been celebrated in the Church as the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary.

We can be inspired, then, by this remarkable story – in whatever difficult situation we might face, turning to Our Lady by praying the Rosary is guaranteed to bring about the graces that we need.
