Dear Parishioners,

Each year, the second last Sunday of October is designated as World Mission Sunday. It is a day to support the missionary efforts of the Church throughout the world, with both our prayers and our financial support.

The work of the Church in bringing the Gospel message to every part of the world goes back to the very beginnings. Before Our Lord ascended into heaven, he gave the great command to his apostles: "Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit" (Matthew 28:19). From that moment onward, the followers of Jesus – for 2000 years – have been trying to live that command.

I so often take for granted the amazing missionary work that so many followers of Jesus have carried out since then. And I often forget how difficult missionary work can be. There are so many heroic men and women who have left everything behind – homes, family, friends, familiar cultures and settings - to travel to far-distant lands in order to spread the message of the Gospel. Quite often, these missionaries go several years without returning home; some of them never return home. One summer during my seminary studies, I spent 3 months in Pakistan. The weather was extremely hot, the culture was quite different, and it was a challenging - though very rewarding experience. I met a number of missionaries who had come from various countries. Some of them had been there for decades, and they had managed to embrace the new culture and living conditions while carrying out wonderful works of charity. None of the work was easy, though, and they depended very much on the prayers and support of benefactors throughout the world. This year, let us remember the amazing missionary work of the Church that has taken place and that continues to take place. Every one of us has depended on the work of missionaries in some way or another – those who have left their homes and made sacrifices to bring to our ancestors the message of Jesus and our Catholic faith.
