Dear parishioners,

We will soon be entering the month of November, which is dedicated to praying for our loved ones who have died. The practice of praying for the deceased is an ancient tradition that goes back to the times before Christ. In the Book of Maccabees, written 1-2 centuries before Jesus, it is recorded that prayers were offered for some who had been killed in a battle. It was recognized that those who had died could still benefit from the prayers and offerings of those who are living.

This is a beautiful way to stay connected to our deceased relatives and friends and to continue to show the love that we have for them. The greatest blessing that we can give to someone who has died is to have a Mass offered for them. At every Mass, of course, we offer prayers and intentions for so many different people and needs. These are sometimes expressed in a concrete way during the Prayers of the Faithful. However, at each Mass there is always a particular intention. The priest will usually say this intention at the beginning of Mass. For instance, if the Mass is being offered for someone who has died, the priest might say, "This Mass is being offered for the repose of the soul of ... ", and then he will say the specific name or names. We still continue to have the other intentions in our minds, but also have the confidence that this particular Mass is giving a great spiritual benefit to that person who has died. The graces from that Mass will lift that person ever higher on his or her journey to heaven after death. There is a beautiful story about St. Monica, a saint of the 4<sup>th</sup> century, and what she told her sons before dying. She did not want them to mourn, and she did not care where she was buried: "One thing only I ask you, that you remember me at the altar of the Lord wherever you may be".




