Dear parishioners,

Do you ever wonder why November is the month when we especially pray for the deceased? Part of the reason is that we begin November with two great feasts – All Saints Day on November 1st and All Souls Day on November 2nd. Those two feasts set the tone, so to speak, for the entire month. There is something interesting, though, about the month of November that also makes it appropriate to pray for the dead.

We must remember that in the history of the Church, most of our liturgical and spiritual practices developed in the Northern Hemisphere. For all of us here, November is a time when nature itself seems to be "dying", in a certain way. The nights get longer; there is less light and more darkness. The leaves have fallen off the trees and many animals go into hibernation. The warmth of the sun decreases and the coldness of winter fast approaches. The Christians of those early centuries looked at all of this with the eyes of faith: it is as though nature is giving us a "reminder" with all of these signs to consider our own mortality and be aware of the reality of death. We can even speak of these events in our natural world as a "sacramental reminder" of death and the need to prayerfully remember the deceased. A beautiful way to honour the deceased in a concrete way is to visit a cemetery. These are peaceful, sacred grounds where we can go and offer special prayers for those who are buried. It's true that cemeteries often bring up sad memories, but the physical grounds and mementos can remind us of the connection we always have with our loved ones.

During the first 8 days of November, the Church offers us a plenary indulgence that can be obtained for the deceased each day that we pray in a cemetery.

I encourage you to take advantage of this beautiful gift that we can offer our loved ones. As we cared for each other in this world, we continue to do so by entrusting them into the loving hands of our heavenly Father.




The Holy Name Choir is seeking new members!
