Dear parishioners,

On this last Sunday before the beginning of the Advent season, we celebrate a feast with a very lofty title: the Feast of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. The feast itself is actually fairly new in the history of Church. It was first declared by Pope Pius XI in 1925, and so we will soon be coming to its 100th anniversary.

When the feast first began, it was at a different time of year – the last Sunday of October. The reason was so that it would be celebrated on the Sunday before All Saints Day, which falls on November 1st. As Pope Pius XI wrote, "before celebrating the triumph of all the Saints, we proclaim and extol the glory of him who triumphs in all the Saints".

In 1970, there were some revisions made to the Church calendar, and the Feast of Christ the King was moved to where it is now. By celebrating the kingship of Jesus at this time of the year, we discover an interesting connection that can help us in our life of faith. Advent, as we know, is a time of preparation for the coming of the Saviour. It concludes with the great celebration of Christmas, the Saviour's First Coming. How wonderful it is that the One whom we proclaim as King of the Universe – such a grand and glorious title - is the same One who chose to be born in such poverty and simplicity – the manger of Bethlehem. The greatness of Jesus as our King comes not only from his majestic power but primarily from his love. And this love moved him to lower himself to our level, embracing our humanity, even in poverty, to win for us our salvation.
