Dear parishioners,

A few years ago, I read a book called *Advent of the* Heart by Fr. Alfred Delp. Fr. Delp was a German priest who was imprisoned by the Nazis during World War II, eventually being executed in 1945. Because of his courageous determination and unwavering Catholic faith, he is considered to be a martyr of the faith. The book is a collection of his Advent sermons, as well as some reflections that he actually composed while he was in prison. It is said that these were often written while he was in handcuffs, using only small pieces of paper that were smuggled in. The writings themselves had to be kept very secretly, as the guards would have certainly had them destroyed due to their message of hope.

I found the story of Fr. Delp to be very inspiring. He showed remarkable courage and had such deep spiritual insights, despite his relatively young age - he was only 37 years old when he was killed. I also found the book to be a very helpful spiritual guide for the Advent season. As we know, there are many distractions that occur during these 4 weeks leading up to Christmas. Many of these are good distractions, and we should do our best to enjoy them. Nevertheless, we must not forget the deeper spiritual meaning of the Advent season. The coming of Christ took place at Christmas, but how deeply have we allowed Jesus to be born and dwell within our hearts? How ready is my heart for Christ when he comes again?

For Fr. Delp, there was a recognition that these messages are relevant throughout the year. We should always keep room in our hearts and our homes for Jesus to dwell. Let us take advantage of this Advent season of 2024 to take stock and re-focus on what matters most to our soul.

I conclude with words from this heroic priest written during the first week of Advent 1944:

"More, and on a deeper level than before, we really know this time that all of life is Advent."


