## **Epiphany of the Lord**



We have come to Homage Him.

Dear parishioners,

The Feast of the Epiphany is considered to be the conclusion of the major Christmas feasts. It was traditionally celebrated on January 6<sup>th</sup> every year, at the end of the proverbial 12 Days of Christmas. Nowadays, we usually move the feast to the closest Sunday to make it easier for everyone to attend Mass. There are still some places in the world, though, that celebrate Epiphany on January 6<sup>th</sup>, no matter what day of the week. The Vatican, for instance, is one of those places – the Holy Father still celebrates the Epiphany on its traditional day of January 6<sup>th</sup>.

I remember from my years in Rome that there is a short saying in Italian about the Feast of the Epiphany: L'Epifania...tutte le feste porta via. It roughly translates as "The Epiphany...takes away all of the feasts". It means that the Epiphany is the last of the celebrations that has the Birth of Jesus at the centre. We gathered with Our Lady and St. Joseph on Christmas night. The shepherds joined us, under the glorious chorus of the angels who announced the Saviour's birth. We prayed at the manger with St. Stephen, St. John the Evangelist, and the Holy Innocents, during their feast days. And then we especially honoured the Holy Family and Our Blessed Mother with their great feast days. Finally, we have welcomed the Three Kings, who come to join us in adoring the King of Kings, born in Bethlehem. To say that the Epiphany takes away all of these feasts does not mean that they are simply gone, not to be considered until next year. What we hope happens is that everything that we have celebrated over these last few weeks will continue to take root in our hearts and bear fruit over the coming years. The celebrations might be over, the decorations will be taken away, but let us pray that the meaning of these great Christmas feasts will remain.

May the lasting effect of Christmas – the peace, joy, and hope that Christ brings – continue throughout the year. And may the light of Christ continue to shine through our darkness and guide us through the coming months.


