Dear parishioners,

On these past few Sundays of Lent, we have celebrated what are called the Scrutinies. These are ancient traditions that took place in the early centuries for those preparing to enter the Church as new Christians. The ceremonies were called Scrutinies because the new members were to "scrutinize" their own lives in the light of the Christian faith that they were about to profess. How would conform their lives more to the Gospel? Was there a part of their lives that needed to change in order to enter into a relationship with Jesus? Were there sinful habits and behaviours that needed to be overcome?

Nowadays, we have three Scrutinies, celebrated on the Third, Fourth, and Fifth Sundays of Lent. We obviously focus our attention on the members of our parish preparing to receive the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, Holy Communion) at Easter. Nevertheless, each one of us should also be "scrutinizing" ourselves and our own lives – how can I live my Catholic faith better as I enter these final weeks of Lent?

After the Third Scrutiny, there is a beautiful ritual that we celebrate with our soon-to-be-new Catholics. We take some time to slowly read through and study the Our Father. This is the Lord's Prayer. It is the prayer that Jesus gave us as the model of all prayer, desiring that all of us be gathered into His arms, trustingly calling God our Father. It is very important that new Christians are open to such a relationship and learn this powerful prayer.

On Wednesday evening of this week, we will have a short ceremony in the church called the Presentation of the Lord's Prayer. It is exactly that – each of the members, in a prayerful way, will be presented with their own beautifully-made copy of the Our Father. It will be a sign that this prayer should now be the foundation of their new Christian life. They will hopefully – as so many of us have done from the time we were small children – learn the prayer and keep it "written", so to speak, in their hearts.

May the printed copy of the prayer be a sign of the love that God wants to pour upon them. May all of us experience the beautiful gift that Jesus gives us in being able to be called children of God.


