Dear parishioners,

We have reached the midpoint of the year 2025. I would like to briefly focus again on the Jubilee Year that the Church throughout the world is celebrating. We began the Jubilee Year at Christmas time, and it will conclude in early January 2026. The theme of the year is “Pilgrims of Hope”. Pope Francis, who led us into the Jubilee Year just a few months before he died, really wanted the Church to proclaim the Gospel message of hope, through words and actions. Our world can often provide moments and events that can lead us to discouragement or despair. However, the light of our faith and Jesus’ message of hope will always have the last word. One of the ways by which we are encouraged to make the Jubilee a part of our lives is by making a pilgrimage. The act of pilgrimage—i.e., travelling to a place of spiritual significance—is a common and ancient practice in almost all religious traditions. The nice thing is that we don’t necessarily have to travel far in order to have a meaningful pilgrimage. With the right, prayerful attitude, we can have a very fruitful pilgrimage experience right in our own city. To assist with this, the Cardinal has designated certain parishes as pilgrimage sites for the Jubilee in the Archdiocese of Toronto. The two major ones are St. Michael’s Cathedral in downtown Toronto and Martyrs’ Shrine in Midland. Holy Name Parish is part of the Central Region, and we have 3 designated pilgrimage sites: St. Paul’s Basilica, St. Mary’s (Bathurst/Adelaide), and St. Edward the Confessor (Yonge/Sheppard). There are other pilgrimage sites located in the Northern, Eastern, and Western Regions of the Archdiocese.

During the summer months, when the weather is nicer and we perhaps have some more free time, making a visit to some of these local pilgrimage sites would be a worthwhile activity. It could be a walking pilgrimage to the churches that are close by. Or we could make a nice road trip to churches of our Archdiocese that we have never visited before. In either case, it can be a prayerful activity—saying prayers on the way and spending a prayerful time in the church, all the while bringing along with us our own personal intentions.

Let us continue to make the Jubilee Year 2025 a special time of prayer and grace, spreading the message of hope to those around us.

***"That Blessed Upper Room"* - Pastoral Letter from Frank Cardinal Leo, Metropolitan Archbishop of Toronto**

His Eminence has released a comprehensive pastoral letter, inviting the faithful of the archdiocese to reflect together on the significance of The Upper Room in our lives, our families and in our communities of faith as this story is so directly connected to pivotal events in the life of Jesus and of the early Church. The letter is divided into nine chapters, dimensions of our Catholic Christian life. In the words of Cardinal Leo: *"This resource can be the object of a parish sharing group or an informal gathering of friends. The reflections can be used as inspiration for summer reading or for Advent or Lenten activities or for a personal retreat. You can, for instance, take one question per day and let it accompany you or set some quiet time per week, a short 15 minutes, to read a paragraph and ask yourself a question that is proposed. Studied and reflected upon individually or in community, whether in families, parishes, schools and religious houses, I pray that this small contribution will help readers and faithful come to a more profound sense of faith, a more mature relationship with the Lord and to a transforming experience of grace."* There is a video on the Holy Name Parish website. 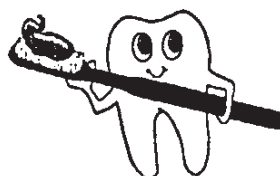
