Dear parishioners,

The month of September concludes in the Church with the Feast of St. Jerome (September 30th). He lived in the 4th century and is best known for the work and study that he did with the Bible. He is credited with translating the Sacred Scriptures into Latin, which was very important and helpful for the Church in those early centuries. The books of the Bible were originally written in different languages—mostly Hebrew and Greek, but even some other ancient languages. St. Jerome took these sacred writings and translated them into Latin, the official language of the Church. He also recognized the absolute importance of the Sacred Scriptures for our faith. He once said that "ignorance of the Scriptures is ignorance of Christ". In other words, we come to know Jesus when we encounter him in the Bible. This especially happens when we read the Gospels, but St. Jerome would say that every single page of the Bible—both the Old Testament and the New Testament—can in some way also give us a deep encounter with and interesting perspective on Jesus. It is a wonderful idea to have a Bible close by, everyday spending even just a few minutes reading the sacred words.

Here in the Archdiocese of Toronto we actually do not celebrate the feast of St. Jerome! The reason is because that day is also the important celebration of the Anniversary of the Dedication of St. Michael's Cathedral. On that day in 1848, after much work, the great building was officially consecrated as the principal church of the Archdiocese of Toronto. Due to its importance for Catholics in Toronto, we all celebrate the anniversary of the dedication each year. Its importance means that it "replaces" the celebration of the feast of St. Jerome on September 30th. This only happens in Toronto because of the special anniversary. So, if you happen to travel to any other place in the world and attend Mass, St. Jerome will be celebrated. This Tuesday, then, let us consider these two great feasts for our faith. We honour St. Jerome and give thanks for his efforts with the Scriptures. Let us also try to get to know the Bible more, thereby getting to know Jesus more.

And let us give thanks for the gift of St. Michael's Cathedral, praying that all of us in the Archdiocese of Toronto will be united in faith.

CHANGE TO SCHEDULING OF THE CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD

Fr. Eric has proposed that we have one Sunday per month where we do not have a separate Liturgy of the Word (downstairs) for the children. On that Sunday, Fr. Eric will plan to tailor the 10 am Mass and homily more to the children in the congregation, perhaps calling the children up close to the sanctuary for the homily. This would be one Sunday each month where the children would be together with their families, and Fr. Eric can speak somewhat directly to the children and families.

For this Fall, the 3 Sundays where the children will stay upstairs and not have a separate Liturgy of the Word (at the 10 am Mass), will be on **October 5**, **November 2**, **and December 28**. The Children's Liturgy of the Word (downstairs) will continue on all the other Sundays until Christmas.
