Dear parishioners,

With Christmas approaching this week, it might seem odd to consider another saint. Yet, for many centuries, December 25th has also included the celebration of an early 4th century martyr of the Church, St. Anastasia. Not many details about her life are known, but she was venerated as a saint soon after her death. She was a faithful Christian, and as was so common in those early centuries, she was persecuted and eventually killed for her faith (on December 25th).

A tradition that developed in Rome in the early centuries was to celebrate 3 Masses on Christmas Day. The first Mass, at midnight, was celebrated at the Basilica of St. Mary Major, the most important church in the world dedicated to Our Lady. How fitting, since she is the one most intimately connected to the Birth of the Saviour. The third Mass, during the day, was celebrated at St. Peter's Basilica with the Pope. Before this, though, there was a second Mass celebrated early in the morning at the basilica of St. Anastasia. What a beautiful experience it would have been: after processing under the night sky from Our Lady's Basilica, pilgrims would arrive at St. Anastasia's basilica for a Mass at dawn. The celebration of the Birth of Jesus would be accompanied by the rising of the sun and the light of the new day.

"The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light," in those words of the Prophet Isaiah, so relevant at Christmas. Moreover, the name Anastasia, in Greek, comes from the word for Resurrection. The Resurrection of Jesus is also considered as the definitive light to overcome all darkness. What a beautiful connection and what amazing symbolism! Jesus came into the world to conquer darkness and bring us eternal life—Christmas, then, points to the Resurrection.

As we begin our Christmas celebrations this week, may the light of Christ arise in our hearts and bring down showers of blessings to us all!


