Dear parishioners,

As we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of Our Lord this weekend, we are given the opportunity to consider our own baptism. However, I would like to consider another sacrament that most of us have received and that is very much connected to baptism: **the Sacrament of Confirmation**.

This month, the catechism classes begin for our young parishioners who will be receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation in May. These classes are very important, as they provide the opportunity for our children to learn more deeply about the faith. The extra effort in coming to the church on a Saturday morning will enable them to benefit from the wonderful graces that the sacrament can give.

The Sacrament of Confirmation is meant to deepen the graces that one has received at Baptism. When one is baptized, the Holy Spirit enters the soul and draws one into a personal relationship with God. Confirmation strengthens these graces so that one can be ready to live as a faithful Catholic in the world. Another important effect of Confirmation is that it deepens the connection to our Archbishop. The effect is obviously seen when Confirmation is administered by a bishop. But what about when the bishop is unable to do so, and Confirmation is administered by the parish priest?

During the ceremony, the central act is when the young person is anointed with a special oil called **sacred chrism**. A large amount of this special oil is blessed at a beautiful ceremony during Holy Week at the Cathedral. It is blessed by the Archbishop, and then representatives from every single parish take a small amount to be used in their communities. Thus, even though the Archbishop cannot be present at every Confirmation ceremony, the sacred chrism that is used comes from his blessing, from his very hands. It is as though he himself is present.

Let us pray for our young people and their families as they prepared for Confirmation. And let all of us who are confirmed call upon the Holy Spirit to deepen our life in the Church, enabling us to be faithful witnesses in the world.

It's SIMPLE:

1. TAP your card on the device
(Each tap will charge your card)



2. After your first TAP, if you would like a TAX RECEIPT, SCAN parish QR Code & register your card right away!
(you only need to register your card once)

Each 'tiptap' gift that you make with your registered card will be available for an end-of-year tax receipt

FAQ

How do I donate different amounts?

- You can only donate the amount that is labelled on the 'tiptap' device.
- However, you can tap the 'tiptap' device multiple times to donate more.
- You can tap a \$5-device 4 times to make a \$20 gift to your parish.

Is my data stored in the device?

- No. The 'tiptap' device does not store any information. It also cannot be hacked as any tampering triggers a signal that shuts down the device.


