Dear parishioners,

Every year, January 18th-25th is designated as the **Week of Prayer for Christian Unity**. These dates were chosen so that the week concludes on January 25th, which is the Feast of the Conversion of St. Paul. During the week, we can try to add this intention to our own personal prayers and to our prayers at home. Sometimes there might be special events that we can attend. Every year, for instance, in Toronto, there is a major prayer gathering that brings together leaders and faithful from many different Christian churches and communities. This year's event will be held this very **Sunday, January 18th, at 4pm at Runnymede United Church**. Representing the Archdiocese of Toronto will be Bishop John Boissonneau, one of our auxiliary bishops. There will be an intriguing perspective to the prayer service this year, as the preparation was entrusted to a writing team from Armenia. The team includes members from the Armenian Apostolic (Orthodox) Church, the Armenian Catholic Church and Evangelical Churches.

Such a prayer service—and the topic of Christian Unity in general—should bring up two perspectives. First, we should be fascinated and impressed with the great variety of expressions of the Christian faith. Living in Toronto, we are confronted by that on a regular basis, but we should not take for granted that just about every country, culture, ethnic group, and language in the world has received and expresses faith in Jesus Christ. It can be quite beautiful and inspiring to behold some of these ancient and magnificent traditions.

The second perspective, though, should make us realize that something quite important is still missing. This is the fact that we, as Christians, are still not fully united. It was one of the deepest desires of the Heart of Jesus that his followers would be united. At the Last Supper, he uttered a powerful prayer to his Heavenly Father—"that they may all be one" (John 17:21). Unfortunately, in the almost 2000 years since that prayer, the full unity of Christians has not been reached. Sometimes, Christians have even done terrible things to each other.

Let us continue to be inspired by the amazing variety by which our faith can be expressed. And let us be motivated by the desire of Our Lord for unity and make an extra effort this week to pray that all who draw strength from his Holy Name may be drawn together as one.

Each 'tiptap' gift that you make with your registered card will be available for an end-of-year tax receipt



FAQ

How do I donate different amounts?

- You can only donate the amount that is labelled on the 'tiptap' device.
- However, you can tap the 'tiptap' device multiple times to donate more.
- You can tap a \$5-device 4 times to make a \$20 gift to your parish.

Is my data stored in the device?

- No. The 'tiptap' device does not store any information. It also cannot be hacked as any tampering triggers a signal that shuts down the device.


