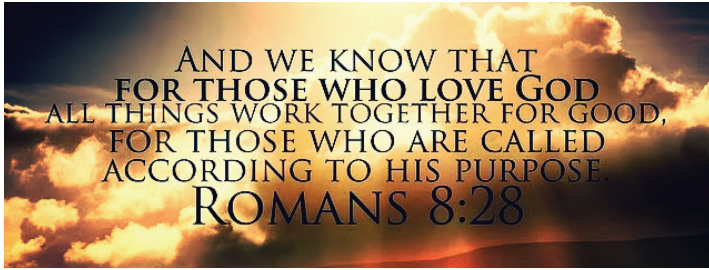

Dear parishioners,

Over the last few weeks, the topic of **providence** has come up several times in conversations, in interesting experiences, and in some of my own thoughts and reading. Divine providence is one of the great comforts and also one of the great challenges that we have in our faith. What it means is that God is closely and intimately involved in our lives, guiding and leading us towards ultimate fulfillment and blessing. There is no aspect of our lives where God is not involved in this way. Every moment and every experience that we go through is accompanied by the presence of God. Granted, it is a presence that is mysterious and can only be recognized by faith, but it is there.

Divine providence, then, can be a great comfort. Life nowadays can be complicated, confusing, uncertain, and difficult. If we can recognize that God is with us at all times, then those moments (or longer periods) of darkness, frustration, or suffering can be easier to bear.

Sometimes, the providence is God really hits us in the face. I'm sure that we've all had those moments when we have experienced an amazing "coincidence" – something that cannot have just happened by chance, but that really reminds us that God is looking out for us and is with us.

Divine providence, though, can also be a challenge. The presence of God is not always obvious. Those "coincidences", wonderful as they are, are usually quite rare. Most of the time we might feel that we are walking alone through life. The challenge deepens when the providence of God ends up leading us through very difficult experiences. Suffering is never easy to bear; God sometimes allows it. We know that it is for a greater good, but when we are in the midst of it, we just want to cry out and complain and beg for it to end.

We can call to mind the words of St. Paul: "All things work together for good for those who love God" (Rom 8:28). The good things and the bad things...God is with us through them all, and he allows everything to happen for a purpose. We might not know the purpose; we might never discover the purpose in this life. But let us trust that God has everything in his hands.
